

CALL FOR PAPERS

Inviting scholars, researchers, graduates students in both the public and private education sectors, and those involved in the education sector, to submit manuscripts or research papers, undertaken individually or collectively, for publication in the ONLINE **Philippine Education Research Journal (PERJ)**.

PERJ (<http://www.perj.org>) is a freely accessible, peer-reviewed, scientific online publication that reports and discusses important educational issues affecting the Philippines. **PERJ** aim is to promote and encourage original EMPIRICAL studies on education from the perspective of disciplines such as anthropology, economics and finance, management, mathematics, medicine, political science, psychology, sociology, and others. Its scope is Philippine education, which is interpreted broadly to include such areas as human development, school education, human capital formation, formal and informal education, and lifelong learning.

Submission should not exceed a total of 10,000 words, including footnotes, references, tables, and figures, except in rare and justifiable cases. Please refer to the ***Manuscript Preparation and Submission Guidelines***.

The Philippine Education Research Journal

The **Philippine Education Research Journal** (PERJ) is a freely accessible, peer-reviewed, scientific online publication (<http://www.perj.org>) that reports and discusses important issues in Philippine education using empirical studies. It uses the normal standards for research publications and seeks to become a respected education journal, first, in the Philippines and, later, in the region. It shall help address issues that are substantively significant in theory and/or practice, with the use of adequate methods. It intends to reach scholars, practitioners, policy makers, specialists and graduate students in both the public and private education sectors. It aspires to be accredited as a scientific journal.

PERJ is published online by the **Fund for Assistance to Private Education (FAPE)**. Each paper is published individually with its unique ID. The journal is made available freely through its website for use by libraries, educational institutions, research centers, scholars, and policy makers.

PERJ interprets education broadly to include such areas as human development, school education, human capital formation, formal and informal education, and lifelong learning.

Operationally, PERJ seeks to:

1. promote and encourage original empirical studies on education from the perspective of disciplines such as anthropology, economics and finance, management, mathematics, political science, psychology, sociology, and others;
2. support the use of scholarship in stimulating discussions of education policies and practices in order to make them more responsive to the needs of society in general, and of Filipinos in particular;
3. use scholarship in clarifying issues in Philippine education for purposes of making decisions, choices, or courses of action; and
4. test and validate theories, constructs and principles proposed to explain, predict and manage educational processes and outcomes.

Criteria for reviewing a submission shall include the significance of the problem, the originality of the contribution, the use of methods that ensure replicability and verifiability of findings, cogency of argument, and the clarity of the writing.

All editors and editorial consultants are respected academics/specialists known for their scholarship.

Prospective authors are enjoined to remember the following aspects of manuscript preparation: its format {digital, using either online modes or by CDs or DVDs, USB flash drives, or compact flash drives}, the format of tabular or chart data (WORD 2007, EXCEL 2007, or a standard statistical package; SPSS is preferred). Other graphics and images must be in jpeg/jpg or tif/tiff format, at least 300 dpi (dots per inch) resolution. If a video is an integral part of the manuscript, it should be saved in a **YouTube** format to facilitate easy access. The language of articles shall be the simple and objective language of scientific publications.

Prospective authors are advised to refer to the **PERJ Manuscript Preparation and Submission Guidelines** (attached) for details on organization of manuscript, number of copies, abstract, citations, tables, charts, indices, references, endnotes, addresses, affiliations, the review process, and other matters.

Publication rights shall remain with the author who shall remain free to publish his article in other publications, provided that the PERJ is informed beforehand and **PERJ** has no objection.
