The Disciple

- **Discipulus** means a student. In the Jewish context, we see a Rabbi having his students around him in order to be close to him, to see what he does, and to live like him so that they may represent him to others.
- **Christian discipleship** involves patterning oneself on a master, and in this case, Jesus, the master (*magister*) is one whose own vocation came to its ultimate expression in suffering.

The key note of discipleship is the close following of Jesus: **COME FOLLOW ME.**

The Apostle

- Apostleship is a post-resurrection concept. The Twelve Disciples became the Twelve Apostles after Jesus sent them: **“As the Father has sent me, so I send you”**.
- The keynote of apostleship is service, primarily as service to Jesus Christ by **representing** him. Christ is the origin and goal of apostolic service.

(5) Pope John Paul II: *“not re-evangelization, but rather of a new evangelization; new in its ardour, methods and expression.”* ...it is the courage to forge new paths in responding to the changing circumstances and conditions facing the Church in her call to proclaim and live the Gospel today.

A **“new evangelization”** is synonymous with **renewed spiritual efforts** in the life of faith within the local Churches, starting with a process to discern the changes in various cultural and social settings and their impact on Christian life, **to reread the memory of faith** and **to undertake new responsibilities** and generate new energies **to joyously and convincingly proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ.**

6) The **first sector** calling for the new evangelization is **culture**. In our times, we find ourselves in an era of a profound **secularism** which has led to a loss in the capacity to listen and understand the words of the Gospel as a living and life-giving message.

..the secularizing movement has taken a more subtle tone in cultural forms which invade people's everyday lives and foster **a mentality in which God is completely or partially left out of life and human consciousness.** ...**secularism** has entered the Christian life and ecclesial communities and has become not simply an external threat for believers but something to be faced each day in life in the various manifestations of the so-called culture of **relativism.**

SECULARIZATION THEORIES

- **Peter Berger:** Secularization is defined as the process by which sectors of society are removed from the domination of religious institutions. Beliefs and values become relative and contextually determined— no longer absolute.

LUCKMAN'S 4 PHASE THEORY

All societies pass through four stages:

1. **Prehistoric**. Responsibility for protecting the sacred rests with the entire society.
2. **Age of Empire**. Responsibility for the sacred rests with a separate institution with strong ties to government
3. **Nation-State**. Religions multiply and the religious institution as a whole occupies only a part of people's lives.
4. **Late Modern**. **Privatized religion** (spirituality) is located in individual consciousness which forms the basis for a pluralistic market supporting a wide diversity of co-existing beliefs.

At the same time, some regions of the world are showing signs of a **promising religious reawakening**. These many positive expectations, resulting from a rediscovery of God and the sacred in various religions, are, however, **being overshadowed by the phenomenon of fundamentalism which oftentimes manipulates religion to justify violence and even terrorism**, a serious abuse of religion. "We cannot kill in God's name!" Furthermore, the proliferation of the sects continues to be an ongoing challenge.

Peter Berger:

“The idea that modernization necessarily leads to a decline of religion is wrong. Modernization has secularizing effects but it has also provoked powerful movements of *counter-secularization*.”

This movement often takes a form called fundamentalism.

Christian Fundamentalism

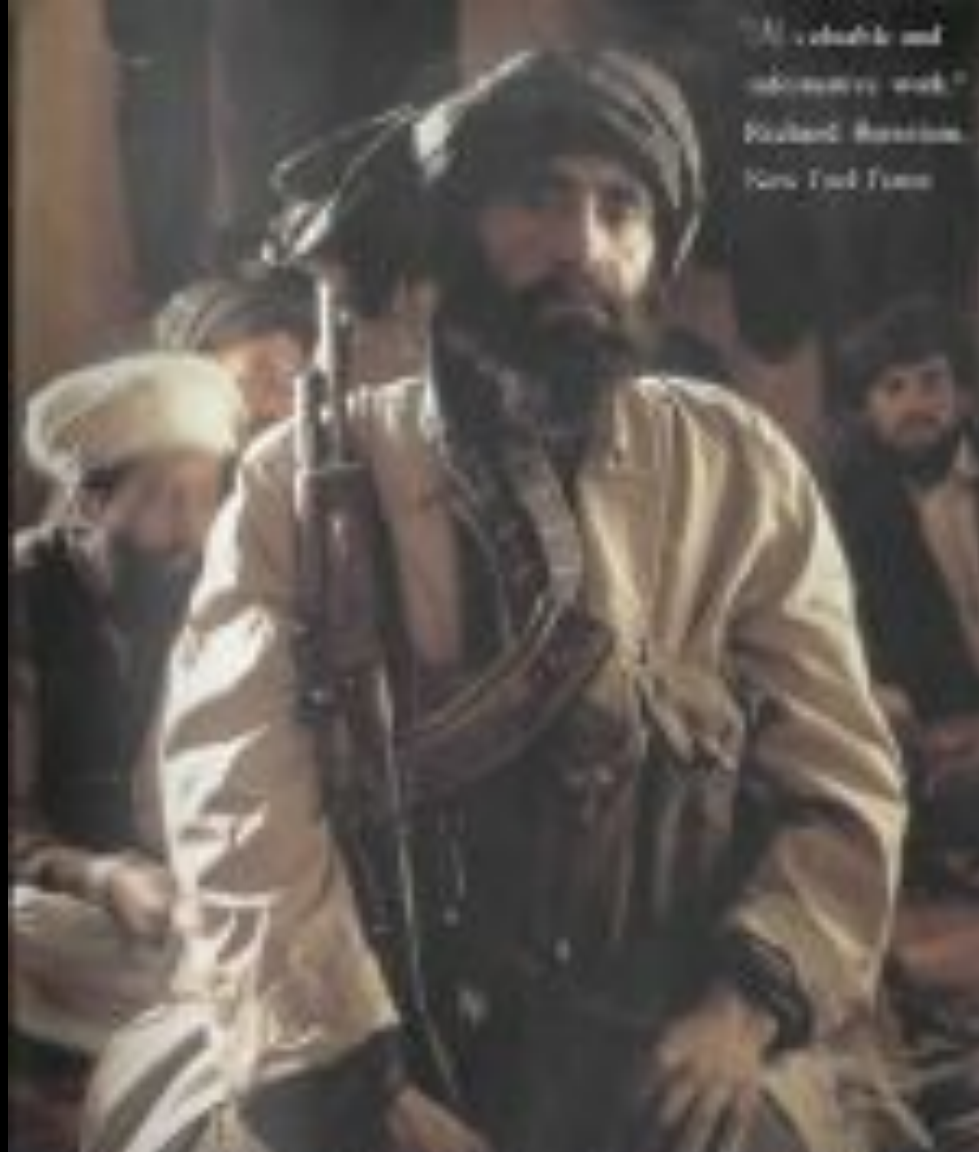
- Originated in 1910 with American Protestants who wanted to go back to “The Fundamentals” of the Christian faith.**
- They upheld creationism over the theory of evolution**
- They favored a literal interpretation of the Bible over other methods of interpretation**
- They are later called the Evangelicals.**



Islamic Fundamentalism

- **Islamic militant fundamentalism became manifest in the Iranian Revolution in 1979. Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini established a theocratic state where the Shar'ia is the law of the land.**
- **The revolution aimed to create an *umma*, a universal Islamic community, the exact opposite of secularization where religion is taken away from the public sphere and privatized.**

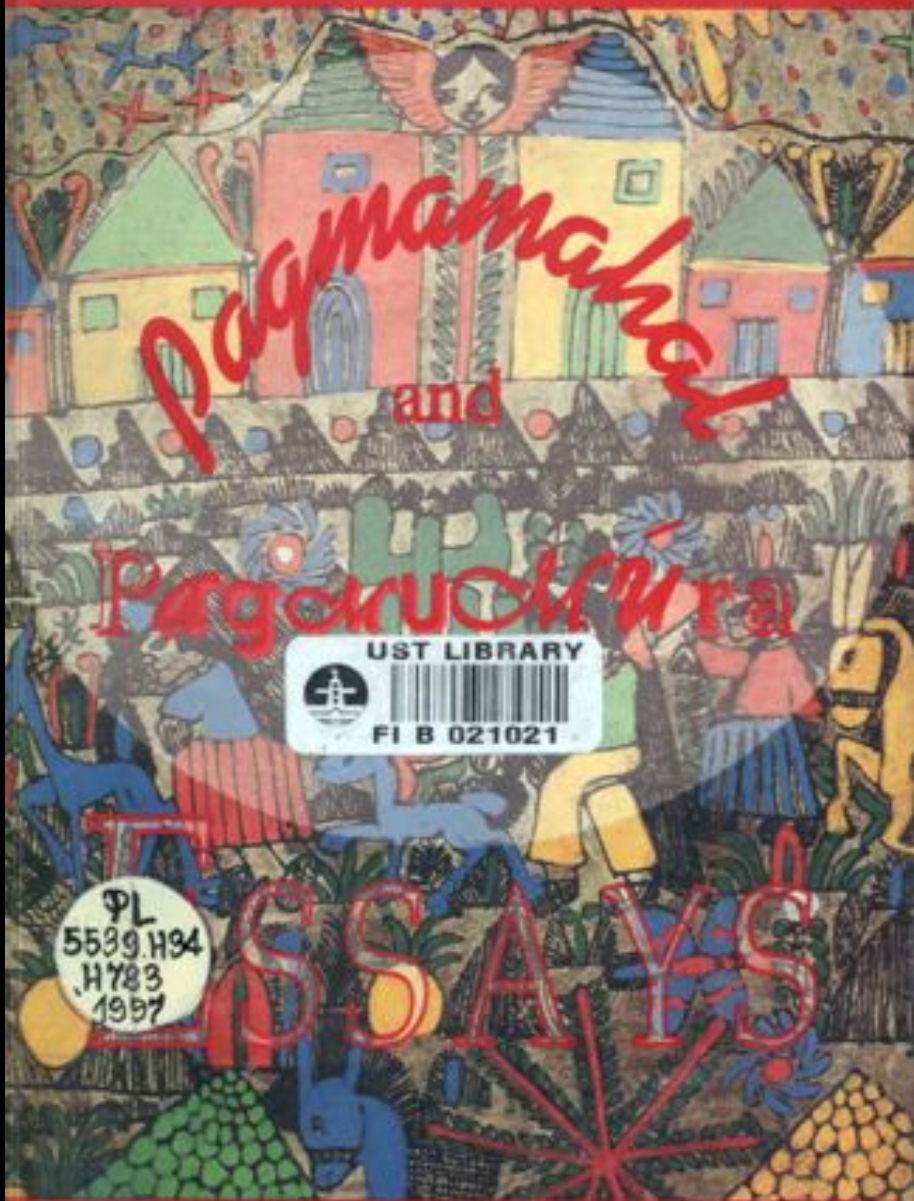
