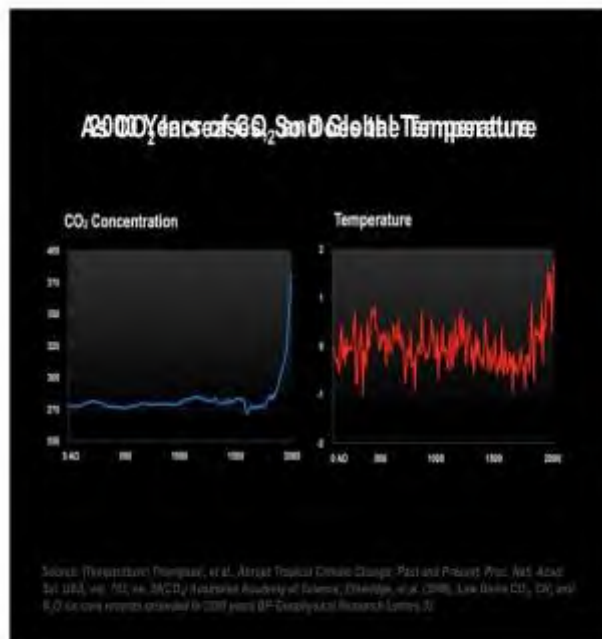
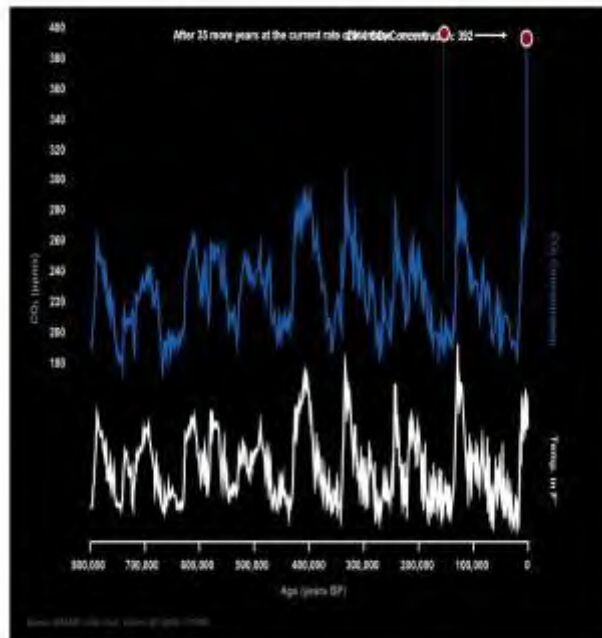






















Which source emits more CO₂?
